Library Lowdown

As the second semester begins, research continues to be a priority in the Douglas Freeman High School Library. Many Juniors and Seniors are beginning the term paper process. The librarians and teachers work collaboratively to provide students with the tools necessary to communicate academic ideas clearly. Students are learning the techniques of reviewing critical analyses of literary works and compiling this information to highlight particular themes. They also are learning to cite sources they use, to employ parenthetical notations as necessary and to recognize and avoid plagiarism. Students are reviewing search strategies for both print and non-print materials. Douglas Freeman High School Library has an excellent collection of print sources to support this type of academic research. Also, HCPS provides a wide variety of electronic resources that augment print material. These online databases can be accessed from the HCPS library web page. Students are able to access these databases at home using their laptop login/password. We encourage students to use these databases for academic research rather than Yahoo or Google. Password protected databases provide valid, factual information which is not always the case with general web directories.

On Wednesday, March second, we will celebrate Dr. Seuss's birthday with our annual participation in "Read Across America" day. Children in our feeder elementary schools are invited to the DSF Library from 6:00P – 7:00P. Students enrolled in the student teacher intern class will read aloud to the children. They also have some craft activities planned. We always look forward to this evening because we get the opportunity to interact with the younger children.

Don't forget to consider a "Legacy Book" purchase to honor your graduating senior. Donations of \$25.00 will purchase a classic piece of literature for our library. National Honor Society News

The fall tapping ceremony for seniors inducted into the National Honor Society was held on Monday, December 6, 2010 in the library. The following seniors were inducted:

The spring tapping will be held in April for eligible juniors. Eligible juniors will be notified during a homeroom in February and will immediately attend an informational meeting in the auditorium to receive further instructions from Mrs. Poates and an NHS sponsor.

Since membership in the National Honor Society is an honor awarded to eligible Douglas S. Freeman High School students, the school wants to continually inform parents and students of the procedure that is followed in the selection of NHS members. The National Honor Society and the staff have attempted to establish a policy of objectivity, while recognizing outstanding contributions of leadership and service amongst its students.

“EXCEL” is the key word in selecting a member into the National Honor Society. Students are selected based on excellence in scholarship, leadership, service, and character. A 3.5 unrounded, cumulative GPA shows scholarship and makes a student eligible for further consideration. Once the minimum GPA is attained at the end of the first semester of the junior year, students are considered further in the areas of leadership, service and character. According to the NHS national constitution each of these areas are weighed equally in the selection of membership. Excelling in one, two or three areas is not enough. **One is expected to excel in all areas.**

Faculty members who have been associated with these candidates, in class and/or in extracurricular activities during the current and/or previous years, rate candidates in the areas of leadership and character. The number of community service hours reported to the school is also taken into consideration. Eligible students are asked to complete a student activity sheet as well as write two essays in the areas of leadership and character. Once the faculty and the students have turned in all forms, a faculty council composed of five members (**not including the faculty sponsors**) meets to review all information and to make recommendations as to those students who best exemplify the areas of leadership, character and service.

Students and their parents are notified, by letter, a week before the induction ceremony as to whether they have been accepted into the National Honor Society. Students must be tapped in order to be members of NHS. If a student is not selected and wishes to meet with the faculty sponsors for an explanation of the committee’s decision, the student must notify one of the NHS sponsors in writing within 5 school days of notification. Once the request has been received the faculty sponsors will set up a meeting to discuss the candidate’s concerns.

Once a student is inducted into the National Honor Society, the expectation is for the student to continue to show the characteristics of scholarship, leadership, service and character. Students are given information as to the expectations of maintaining membership in the NHS such as providing tutoring, attending meetings and participating in community service. It is an honor to be inducted and the sponsors look forward to working with the new members.

Freeman Fund

Thanks to all the DSF parents that have contributed to the Freeman Fund. 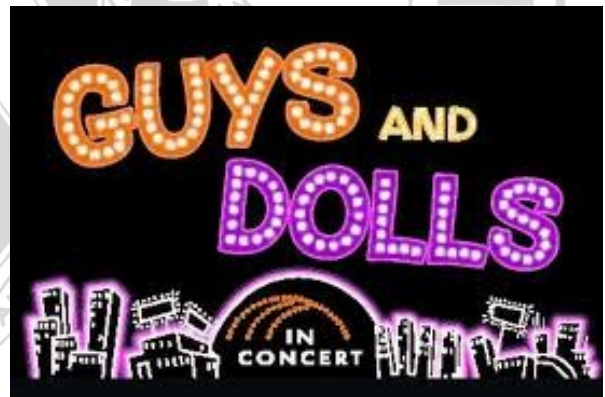
