**Fall Sports Banquet will be held on

The Freeman Rebels are winding up the Fall Season and some teams have advanced to district and regional playoffs. Here is a brief summary of our teams to date.

Golf Team- Our team finished 4th in the district and 2 players, Davis Boyd and Jack Lowden advanced to Regionals.

Football- The 9th grade team has been undefeated to date, while the JV has had a little tougher season. After an exciting win versus Patrick Henry (our first since 2004), the Varsity team will finish the season with John Marshall and Godwin.

Volleyball-

- Boys JV - their record was 12 -1 and the only loss came against Deep run.
- Boys Varsity - 7-1 in District play with an exciting five set match against Deep Run. Will advance to Districts and are ranked 3rd in the State.
- Girls 9th - A growing season, with a lot of the team playing for the first time.
- Girls JV - 14-5 regular season record and 2nd in the JV tournament.
- Girls Varsity - Advanced to District play

Cross Country - The boys team are Colonial District Champions and the girls team finished 3rd.

How could the month of October go by so fast? With all of the activity in the Library, the days just flew!

We celebrated National Teen Read Week Oct. 18th – 22nd with a “Famous Last Lines” contest. Each year, many students participate and tell us they look forward to this annual event.

Many classes have been visiting the Library for a variety of assignments. Supreme Court cases, Science Fair projects, C. S. Lewis projects and American and British/World authors research papers are just a few of the topics students have been investigating. Thirty classes have come to the Library to check out books for pleasure reading/book reports. Research indicates that the more a child reads, the better he/she performs in all academic areas. We are grateful that the Douglas Freeman faculty supports and promotes the importance of reading.

Many individual and group tutoring sessions have been held in the Library. Students receive assistance for individual courses and for SOL preparation.
